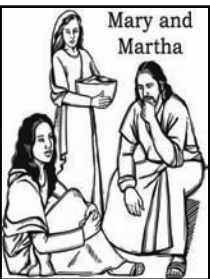

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

On singing the Kyrie.

The musical tradition of the universal Church is a treasure of inestimable value, greater even than that of any other art.... The Church acknowledges Gregorian Chant as specially suited to the Roman liturgy: therefore, other things being equal, it should be given pride of place in liturgical services. — Second Vatican Council, *Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy*.

I desire, in accordance with the request advanced by the Synod Fathers, that Gregorian Chant be suitably esteemed and employed as the chant proper to the Roman Liturgy. — Pope Benedict XVI, Apostolic Exhortation *Sacramentum Caritatis*.

“The medium *is* the message.” This aphorism coined by Marshall McLuhan is often misunderstood but it applies perfectly to the singing of the *Kyrie* at the beginning of Mass. *Kyrie eleison, Christe eleison* (‘Lord have mercy, Christ have mercy’) has always been sung in *Greek*, even when the rest of the Mass was in Latin. During the middle ages, pilgrims visiting Jerusalem were impressed by the singing of the *Kyrie* at the sacred liturgy. When they returned home to Europe they incorporated it into their own celebration of the Mass — keeping it, just as they learned it, *in Greek*. Today these simple Greek phrases — *Kyrie eleison, Christe eleison* — unite us in spirit with our forefathers in the faith, with the divine liturgy in the Holy Land, and also with every celebration of the Mass around the world. This is the part of the wealth of symbolism in the Liturgy. But we need to remember that the *whole point* of the *Kyrie* is that is in Greek! A translation into English completely obliterates the message — because, in this case, Greek is not just the medium, it *is* the message.

Furthermore, the *Kyrie* is meant to be sung! Following the Second Vatican Council, a committee was formed to revise the liturgy. Some members of this committee wanted to eliminate the *Kyrie* altogether because it was a *medieval* addition to the Mass. After much heated discussion, it was decided that it must be kept — *because it was sung!*

Over the centuries a rich musical tradition has developed for singing the parts of the Mass — this includes not only the ancient Gregorian Chant, but also choir and orchestral settings by such great composers as Palestrina and Mozart. The fathers of the Second Vatican Council declared that this musical tradition is “a treasure of inestimable value, greater even than that of any other art.” It was for this reason that the *Kyrie* (along with the *Gloria, Credo, Sanctus*, and *Agnus Dei*) could not be discarded.

Now, it is true that the current General Instruction on the Roman Missal permits these parts of the Mass to be *spoken* in *English*, but it is perfectly clear to me that the *Kyrie* is meant to be *sung* in *Greek*! I never do it any other way.
