The Narrow Door

You bore me, a man of strife and contention, for the whole land! Jeremiah 38.4-6, 8-10

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Stand firm in the faith, act like men, be strong!.

The Second Vatican Council did not formulate anything new in matters of faith, nor did it wish to replace what was ancient. Rather, it concerned itself with seeing that the same faith might continue to be lived in the present day, that it might remain a living faith in a world of change. — Pope Benedict XVI

These words of Pope Benedict were spoken ten years ago in his homily at the Holy Mass for the opening of the ‘Year of Faith.’ The main theme of Benedict’s pontificate can be summed up in the phrase, ‘the hermeneutic of continuity.’ A ‘hermeneutic’ is a manner of interpretation; it is the ‘lens’ through which we see something. With respect to the Second Vatican Council, Pope Benedict described two different ways of interpreting the Council.

The first way is the ‘hermeneutic of discontinuity and rupture.’ This interprets the Council as a clear break with the past both in terms of the Church’s doctrine and practice. We are now seeing this playing out in the German “Synodal Path” and in Pope Francis’ “Synod on Synodality.” Every doctrine and practice is now seemingly ‘up for grabs,’ not excluding homosexual unions and female ordination.

The second way is a ‘hermeneutic of continuity.’ Here is how Pope Benedict describes it, harkening back to Pope John XXIII’s own stated intentions for the Council:

Pope John XXIII unequivocally expresses a hermeneutic (of continuity) when he says that the Council wishes ‘to transmit the doctrine, pure and integral, without any attenuation or distortion.’ it is necessary that ‘adherence to all the teaching of the Church in its entirety and preciseness’ be presented in ‘faithful and perfect conformity to the authentic doctrine, which, however, should be studied and expounded through the methods of research and through the literary forms of modern thought. The substance of the ancient doctrine of the deposit of faith is one thing, and the way in which it is presented is another, retaining the same meaning and message.’

In his homily of ten years ago Pope Benedict issued this dire warning:

Recent decades have seen the advance of a spiritual ‘desertification.’ At the time of the Second Vatican Council it was already possible from a few pages of history to know what a life or a world without God looked like, but now we see it every day around us. This void has spread.

We are living in a time of social upheaval, and the Church is not immune from the confusions of our time. For this very reason, we need to heed the words of St. Paul: “Stand firm in the faith, act like men, be strong.”
