#### FROM THE DESK OF FR. GLASS:

Hawking vs Augustine on creation in time.

When men withdraw their intellect from divine truths they thus limit it within a narrower circle of knowledge. This is why we often see men of great intellectual power and erudition making the grossest blunders even in natural science. — Pope Leo XIII

The existence of God can be proved in three words: 'nihil sine causa' — nothing without a cause. To say that something 'just happens' without a cause is irrational. This applies to the coming into being of the universe.

The late Stephen Hawking, a brilliant physicist, opened a lecture on the origins of the universe this way:

If one believes that the universe had a beginning, the obvious question is, "What happened before the beginning?" What was God doing before He made the world? Was He preparing Hell for people who asked such questions?

He answers the question in his posthumously published book, *Brief Answers to the Big Questions*:

You cannot get to a time before the Big Bang, because there was no time before the Big Bang. Since time itself began at the moment of the Big Bang, it was an event that could not have been caused or created by anyone or anything. So when people ask me if a god created the universe, I tell them the question itself makes no sense. Time did not exist before the Big Bang, so there is no time for God to make the universe in.

My great saint, St. Augustine, in his most famous work, *The Confessions*, also answers the question, "What was God doing before he created the universe?"

My response is not: "He was preparing Hell for those who ask impertinent questions." It is one thing to make fun of the questioner and another to find the answer.

A foolish person might wonder why God should have allowed countless ages to elapse before he finally undertook the vast work of creation. But his wonder is based on a misconception. How could those countless ages have elapsed when You, the Creator, in whom all ages have their origin, had not yet created them? What time could there have been that was not created by You? How could time elapse if it never was?

You are the maker of all time. If then there was any time before You made heaven and earth, how can anyone say You were idle? You must have made that time, for time could not elapse before You made it.

If there was no time before the universe was created, how could anyone ask what You were doing before "then"? If there was no time, there was no "then."

Hawking unwittingly repeats Augustine's quip about God 'preparing Hell' while being ignorant of what follows. As they say: "Atheism is easy to refute, but hard to cure."


